Students younger than 21 who have earned fewer than 60 college credit hours reside in one of our 14 residence halls (unless exempt).

No on-campus attendance is required, and you can engage in the course at any time.</p>	 <h3>Livestream</h3> <p>Regularly scheduled class sessions are delivered via Zoom, with real-time interaction between you, the faculty and students. No on-campus attendance is required.</p>
 <h3>Hybrid</h3> <p>Delivered as a blend of face-to-face and online, face-to-face and livestream, or online and livestream. Classes meet at regular, scheduled intervals. Your faculty member will share the dates and times when on-campus or livestream attendance is required.</p>	 <h3>Hyflex</h3> <p>You decide whether to attend the class face-to-face, via livestream at scheduled times, online anytime, or any combination.</p>

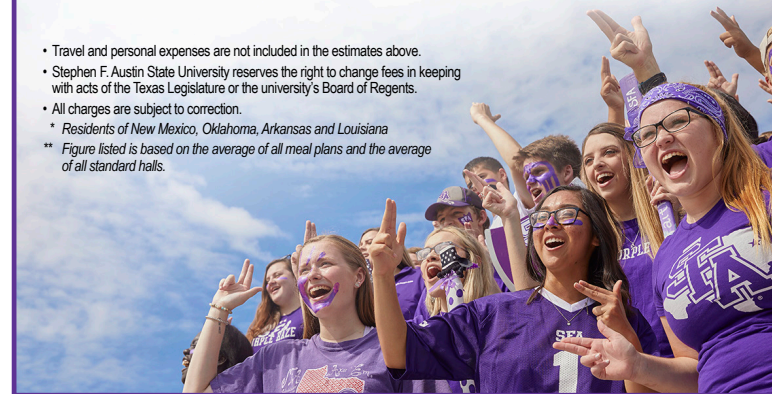
2020-21 Estimated Semester Educational Costs at SFA

Any Texas resident undergraduate student enrolled in 12 hours or more will be charged an annual flat-rate tuition of \$5,300 per long semester for the 2020-21 academic year.

Completing 15 credit hours per semester helps students finish a degree in four years.

In response to limited testing due to COVID-19, SFA is offering **test-optional admissions** for all **2021 terms**.

While SAT and ACT scores are not required for an admission decision, you are encouraged to submit a score, as **SAT and ACT test scores may still be needed in the scholarship review process.**

TRANSFER ADMISSION

Transfer students must have completed 15 transferable hours, with a minimum **2.0 GPA** overall, and not be on suspension from another educational institution.

Military Credit

- Students who have served in the military may request an evaluation of their military experiences from the Office of Admissions by submitting their joint services transcript.

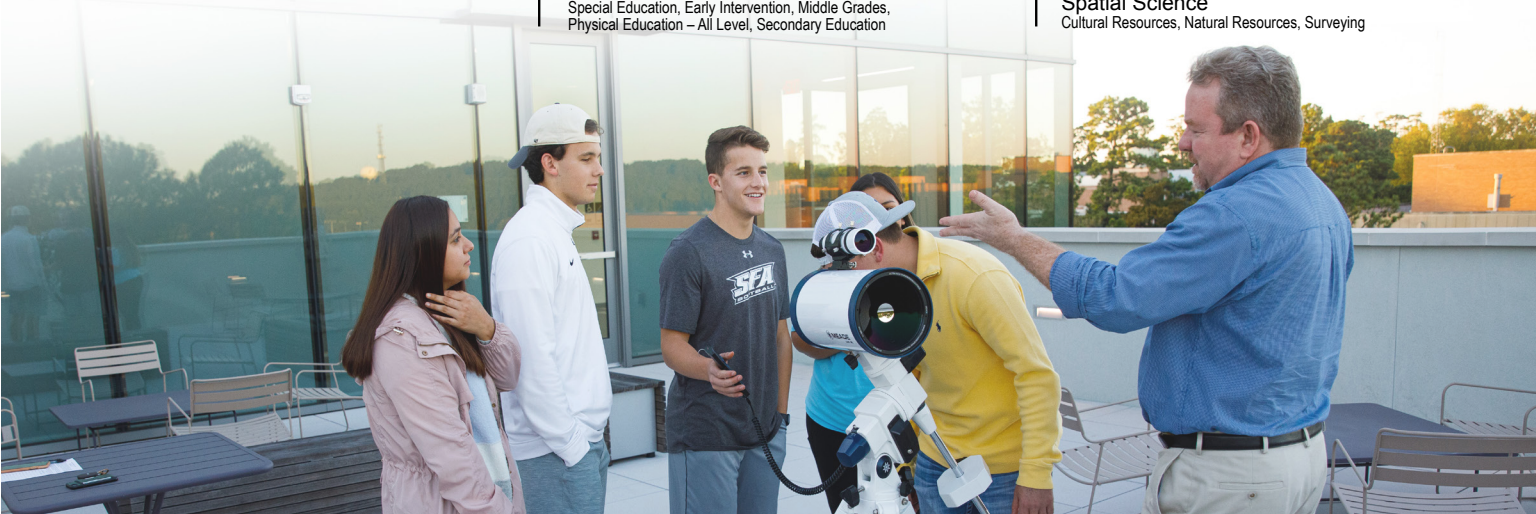

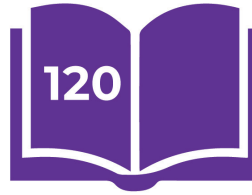
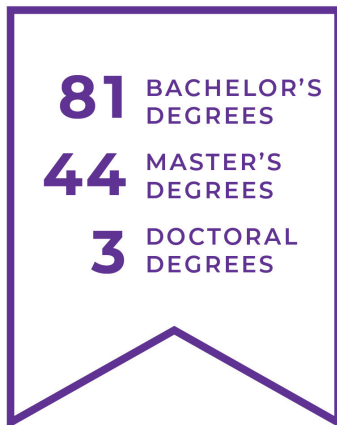
