While SAT and ACT scores are not required for an admission decision, you are encouraged to submit a score, as SAT and ACT test scores may still be needed in the scholarship review process.

-SCHOLARSHIPS

Freshman Academic Excellence

\$3,000 top 10% or top 25%

with a minimum score of 1170 on SAT or 24 on ACT

Community College Transfer

\$1,000 per year if the student's GPA is 3.0 to 3.49

\$2,000

per year if the student's GPA is 3.50 or higher

Transfer students must have completed 15 transferable hours, with a minimum 2.0 GPA overall, and not be on suspension from another educational institution.
